Dear agents of the United States, Even nearly 47 years after the enactment of the Federal Depository Library (*Pub. L. 60-620* of October 22, 1968; *44 USC 1701-1722* and *1901-1916*), the Administrative Committee of the Federal Register (ACFR) has failed its ministerial duty under *44 USC 1506(3)* to prescribe any regulations (see *Chapter I of Title I of the CFR*) with respect to the distribution to the Federal depository libraries of the daily issues of the Federal Register and of the **analytical subject index covering their contents** and thereby have failed their duty to inform the public of their free use in such Federally funded sources of information. Instead, the ACFR misleads and confuses the public under *1 CFR 11.1* by prescribing that "**They are not available for free distribution to the public**". In fact, since the ACFR started prescribing Federal Register regulations in 1937 (see *6 FR 4397-4402*, *11 FR 9833-9840*, *13 FR 5929-5936*, *24 FR 2343-2355*, *29 FR 11782-11794*, *30 FR 9573*, *30 FR 15122-15134*, *31 FR 15013*, *34 FR 19106-19119*, *37 FR 23602-23615*, *41 FR 56623-56625*, *46 FR 7162*, *50 FR 12462*, *54 FR 9670*, *59 FR 185*, *61 FR 68117-68119*, *65 FR 8841-8844*), the ACFR has never prescribed any distribution regulations with respect to the Federal Depository Libraries!!! Dear agents of the United States, Referring to the current version of *1 CFR 11.3 (Code of Federal Regulations)*, it is missing 1994 and 1996 source; *1 CFR 11.5 (Public Papers of the Presidents of the United States)* is missing all sources; *1 CFR 11.7 (Federal Register Index)* is missing 1994, 1996, 2000 and 2001 sources; and *1 CFR 11.8 (List of Sections Affected)* is missing 1994, 1996, 2000 and 2001 sources. With respect to *1 CFR 11.6*, it is not only missing 1994, 1996, 2000 and 2001 sources but it appears to have been secretly repealed sometime after 2005. Sincerely, Brady Eames
